

Aspirated consonant: puff of breath

Pronunciation in English: Cake, Colorado

(aspirated = breath)

Examples in Hindi

Khaanaa, kholnaa, khelnaa

Examples in Hindi

Ghar, gharaanaa, ghun, ghoomnaa, ghee, ghoos

घर, घराना, घुन, घूमना, घी, घूस

Inherent "a" vowel and word endings

If there is no vowel indicated after a consonant, the consonant is followed by the vowel sound "a."

But there is an important exception to this rule!

If there is no vowel indicated at the end of a word, no vowel is pronounced after the final consonant. That is to say, there is no inherent "a" at the end of a words.

This concept will be illustrated in the examples on the next slide.



Inherent "a" vowel and word endings

- 1. Kak-中中
- 2. Ghak-घक
- 3. Kakha-केख

Each vowel has 2 forms

 Independent Form: it occurs alone, at the beginning of words, and after vowel symbols.

Dependent Form: Maatraa- used when a vowel follows consonants.

Vowel

अ-A is attached to consonants by default.

Pronounce as in English about, cut, but, nut, America

Examples in Hindi Apnaa, akelaa, ab, albelaa, achchhaa अपना, अकेला, अब, अलबेला, अच्छा
